Memorandum that on the seventh day of September in the eighteenth year of the reign of our Lord Charles the Second by the grace of God King of England Scotland France and Ireland defender of the faith etc came before me John Underwood knight one of the Justices of the Peace of the said Lord King in the said County John Clift of the parish of Saint Bridgetts otherwise Brides in the aforesaid County gunsmith and made recognizance that he owes forty pounds to the said Lord King and Hugh Osborne of the same [parish] blacksmith and John Moriton of the same [parish] cutler and others made recognizance that they owe to the said Lord King twenty pounds of good and legal money of England to be levied etc under the following condition

Condition that if [th]e said John Clift p[er]sonally appeare at [th]e next generall Quarter Sessions of [th]e peace to be held for the County aforesaid then & there to answere being suspected to be in [th]e plot of firing [th]e City Jo[hn] Underwood
