A Common Council holden at Gresham House on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> day of September 1666 and in the 18<sup>th</sup> year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord Charles II now King of England etc. before Sir Thomas Bludworth knight Mayor of the City of London, Thomas Adams knight and baronet Alderman, Richard Chiverton knight Alderman, Thomas Aleyn knight and baronet, William Wyld knight and baronet Serjeant at Law and Recorder of the City of London, William Bolton knight Alderman, Samuel Starling Esq Alderman, Joseph Sheldon Esq Alderman and Robert Hanson and William Hooker knights Aldermen and Sheriffs of the same City and also the greater part of the Commons in the Common Council of the same City then & there assembled

Sir Rich[ard] This Court being informed That some Pap[er]s have beene

Upon ye Petic[i]on of John Richardson Esq & Citizen & Goldsmith of London shewing that in ye Majoralty of Sir John Dethick he was discharged from the place of an Ald[e]rman for ye ffine of CCC<sup>II</sup> which he paid into ye Chamber of London And he being lately chosen one of the Sheriffes of this City & County of Midd[lesex] for ye yeare ensueing he appeared before the Court of Ald[e]r[m]en with his Compurgators to have sworne he was not really worth M<sup>II</sup> thereby to be exempted from that Office But that upon the Promise of the Court of Ald[e]r[m]en That he should be recomended by this Court to pay noe more then CC<sup>II</sup> he was induced to seale a Bond for the Paym[en]t of CCCC<sup>II</sup> as was usuall And therefore praying upon Paym[en]t of CC<sup>II</sup> to be exempted from that Office And to have his Bond delivered
