Hon[ou]red Gent[le]men
I whose name is undernamed: am desired by frinds
of mine, to declare and attest unto you what I
seen in [th]e late fatall destruction of [th]e
once famous citty of London by the inutricible
fire, As I was in a frinds house in ffyfott Lane Lon
don on [th]e 3 ^d of September in ye year 1666 wheras
I was desired to go in to [th]e house to see how near [th]e
fire was. I went in with some folks of [th]e house to
their garrett [tha]t was empty: Standing their with
the folks a little while: Immediately their
came a wild fire-ball by my eares: who
fell fiercely into [th]e Corner of [th]e Roome and
pierc[e]d a hole in [th]e boards to [th]e bottome & then
presently it woosd up in smoke & flames of
fire: [tha]t I was faine to make hast downe
and leap outt of [th]e window two pair of stairs
and others with me: yet [th]e maine fire was a
good way off in Thames Street from [th]e houses
After my Escape I went and acquainted the
Lord Mayor then of the above said
Relation and this I shall
attest upon oath if legally
be called unto
